Felix Hell Joins in POE Summer Reunion

As a follow-up to last summer's highly successful St. Louis AGO Chapter-hosted Pipe Organ Encounter (POE), Chapter members hosted a POE reunion July 18-19.

The event began with the Felix Hell recital at the Cathedral Basilica. The following morning, eight POE students assembled in the organ loft at Christ Church Cathedral for a masterclass with Cathedral Music Director Pat Partridge. The group then traveled a few blocks north to the Shrine of St. Joseph and climbed to the organ loft on the top balcony. Long-time Shrine organist Ralph Ellerbrock gave a short lecture on the architectural features of the sanctuary. Martin Ott, president of the Ott Pipe Organ firm in St. Louis, explained the techniques he used in doing a historical restoration of the 1890 Pfeffer tracker instrument, after which the students took turns pumping the bellows and playing the organ.

After lunch at Vito's Pizza restaurant, it was time for the afternoon masterclass at the Cathedral Basilica. Felix Hell joined the

group, and the students had an opportunity to talk with him and ask him questions about his career. He then joined Cathedral Basilica Director of Music and Organist John Romeri in working with the students as they played their performance pieces.

A big thank-you to all who helped make the reunion a success: to John Romeri for planning and organizing the event and hosting at the Cathedral Basilica, to Pat Partridge for hosting and teaching the masterclass, to Martin Ott for hosting at the Shrine of St. Joseph, and to Max Tenney and Dean Martha Shaffer for help with chaperoning and transportation.




