This program is designed for teenagers who have an interest in the pipe organ. The POE is open to young people ages 13 through 18 who have early-intermediate piano skills, but who may or may not have studied organ previously.

The POE Committee may choose to grant special consideration on an individual basis for admission of a potential registrant whose age or training is different than the guidelines.
