During this session, we will take a trip through the church year. For each liturgical season, two works will be approached, one each from the European choral and American shaped-note traditions. Come prepared to sing through some wonderful anthems by William Billings, Daniel Read, Martin How, John Bull, Michael Haydn, Palestrina, and other composers, and to focus on choral techniques designed to bring out unique aspects in each work.

Anthem's selected will range both in difficulty and stylistic era. New repertoire ideas and something for everyone is the goal!

Kathryn Smith Bowers is a professor of music at Webster University, where she directs the choral activities, music education, and church music programs. She has conducted choirs and orchestras in Indianapolis, St. Louis, Washington DC, and Varna, Bulgaria, and presented papers on a variety of historical and contemporary topics in Finland, Canada, England, New Zealand, South Africa, Hungary, and the US. In her spare time, she transcribes, edits, and composes choral music. Her doctorate in choral music was earned at the University of Illinois-Urbana with a thesis on early 17th-century English verse anthems for voices and viols. Other music degrees were completed at the University of Oregon and Northwestern University. Bowers was named 2002 Choral Director of the Year by the St. Louis chapter of the AGO.






