An internationally recognized choral director, Henry Leck is an associate professor and Director of Choral Activities at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 1986 he became Founder and Artistic Director of the Indianapolis Children's Choir, an organization which currently includes over 1700 children and youth in eighteen choirs. The Touring Choirs of the Indianapolis Children's Choir have performed regularly for National ACDA, MENC, OAKE and AOSA Conferences. Additionally, ICC tours internationally every year, singing in prestigious concert sites throughout Europe, South America, North America and China.

Mr. Leck is widely known as a specialist in choral techniques, the child's voice and the boy's changing voice. He recently authored the choral section of Silver Burdett music textbooks for grades 4, 5, and 6; has produced two teaching videos entitled "Vocal Techniques for the Young Singer" and "The Boy's Changing Voice - Take the High Road." He is a lead editor for a new choral textbook series being published by McGraw Hill/Glencoe. He is also the editor of two nationally known choral series published by Hal Leonard Corporation and Colla Voce, Inc./Plymouth.

GUILMANT SYMPOSIUM

In celebration of the centennial of the 1904 World's Fair, the St. Louis Chapter of the American Guild of Organists together with the Music Department of Washington University in St. Louis will present a Symposium about the organ at the World's Fair. Alexandre Guilmant, the great French organist and composer, played no fewer than 40 recitals on the organ housed in Festival Hall at the 1904 World's Fair. This organ was later purchased by John Wananmaker and moved to the Wanamaker Department Store in Philadelphia where it is still heard in recital twice daily.

The Symposium will begin on Friday, March 19, 2004 with a concert by Thomas Murray and continue the next day, Saturday, March 20, 2004 with three lectures and a Master Class with Thomas Murray.






