On our November 24 meeting, Dr. Franklin Perkins and Mezzo-Soprano Kathryn Lawton-Brown will be presenting a lecture recital featuring vocal selections from the Baroque to the present that are suitable as solo material for worship.

They will be stressing the simple, practical, easy accompaniment, good literature that is not usually done, (but should be used!). Dr. Perkins, mostly known in the area as an organist, started his musical career as a vocal soloist.

Through his many years as a church musician, he acquired great knowledge of vocal literature for liturgical use, which he will be sharing with us. Kathy Brown, voice teacher at UMSL, has served many churches in the area as a soloist. With a vast repertoire knowledge, acquired through many years of teaching, Kathy always has interesting repertoire suggestions for church musicians. This will be a useful lecture if you need new ideas- or just need to have your memory refreshed about some piece of music that has left your 'radar-screen.'





CHILDREN'S CHOIR FESTIVAL

An internationally recognized choral director, Henry Leck is an associate professor and Director of Choral Activities at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 1986 he became Founder and Artistic Director of the Indianapolis Children's Choir, an organization which currently includes over 1700 children and youth in eighteen choirs. The Touring

Choirs of the Indianapolis Children's Choir have performed regularly for National ACDA, MENC, OAKE and AOSA Conferences. Additionally, ICC tours internationally every year, singing in prestigious oncert sites throughout Europe, South America, North America and China.

Mr. Leck founded the Indiana All-State Children's Honor Choir and the Indiana Middle/Junior High School Honors Choir, and has conducted Mixed, Men's, Women's, Junior High and Children's All-State Choirs and festival choirs in nearly every state. He is a frequent conductor of regional and national honor choirs, including the ACDA Southern, Southwest, North Central, Central and Northwest Divisional Honors Choirs. In the spring of 2003, he conducted the ACDA National Junior High/Middle School Honor Choir in New York City and on three occasions has conducted National Honor Choirs for OAKE.

Mr. Leck has conducted many international festivals including the Musica Mundi Tuscany Children's Choir Festival in Montecatini, Florence and Rome, Italy. He annually conducts the International Children's Choral Festival in Canterbury and London, England. Additionally, Mr. Leck regularly conducts the Vienna Children's & Boys Choir Festival with the Vienna Sangerknaben. He has also conducted many times in Brazil, including the Curso Internacional de Regencia Coral in Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo, Brazil, where he founded the ARCI Sao Paulo Children's Honor Choir. Mr. Leck has served as a clinician for the Australian National Choral Association and the Royal School of Church Music. He

has also taught at International Choral Workshops in Norway, Brazil, and Austria. In 2004, he will conduct the Children's Choral Festival of the Ages in Germany, France and Luxembourg and an International Choral Festival in Beijing, China. He is the Artistic Director of the highly acclaimed Pacific Rim Festival in Hawaii, and for ten years has conducted the National Youth Choral Festival in Carnegie Hall.

Mr. Leck is widely known as a specialist in choral techniques, the child's voice and the boy's changing voice. He recently authored the choral section of Silver Burdett music textbooks for grades 4, 5, and 6; has produced two teaching videos entitled "Vocal Techniques for the Young Singer" and "The Boy's Changing Voice - Take the High Road." He is a lead editor for a new choral textbook series being published by McGraw Hill/Glencoe. He is also the editor of two nationally known choral series published by Hal Leonard Corporation and Colla Voce, Inc./Plymouth.

Mr. Leck is certified as a "Kodaly" instructor and is an active member of ACDA, OAKE, MENC, AOSA and Pi Kappa Lambda. In 1992 he was named the "Outstanding University Music Educator of the Year" by the IMEA. Mr. Leck received his training from the University of Wisconsin, the University of Colorado and Indiana University where he received a master's degree in choral conducting. Each year he teaches his conductor's workshop entitled "Creating Artistry" at venues across the country.


