

Our presenter for the weekend is Dr. Scott M. Hyslop. His educational background includes receiving the DMA in Organ/Church Music at The University of Michigan, where he was a student of Marilyn Mason, a Master's Degree in Church Music from Concordia University – River Forest, IL, and a Bachelor of Music Degree from the University of Wisconsin – River Falls. In addition to his formal studies, he studied with Dr. Manz through the Lutheran School of Theology and the Paul Manz Institute of Church Music in Chicago. He has also had additional study in organ performance with Maurice Clerc at the Cathedral of St. Bénigne in Dijon, France. As a vocalist, Dr. Hyslop has studied with Wendy Bloom, Nada Radakovich, and David Daniels. He is a resident member of the choral ensemble *sounding Light* and *Exultate Deo*. His biography on Paul Manz "The journey Was Chosen: The Life and Work of Paul Manz" was published in June of 2007 by MorningStar Music Publishers, and his book, "The Precious gift: The Hymns, Carols, and Translations of Henry L. Lettermann, (2013) received the Award of Commendation from the Concordia Historical Institute in November of 2014. In January of 2017, his middle school choir at St. Lorenz Lutheran School sang the treble choir portion for the North American premiere of Sir Karl Jenkins Cantata Memoria: For the children of Aberfan at Carnegie Hall in New York City. He has served congregations in Minneapolis, MN, Chicago, IL, and Stuart, FL. Dr. Hyslop presently serves as the Director of Parish Music at St. Lorenz Lutheran Church in Frankenmuth, MI. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for Lutheran Music Programs, which is the home for Lutheran Summer Music, as well as a past member of the Board of Directors for the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, and the advisory board for the Center for Church Music based at Concordia University in Chicago. Dr. Hyslop and his family currently reside in Birch Run, MI.

St. Louis Chapter co-hosted a French Music Marathon!

Founded on Saint Valentine's Day of 1764 by French fur traders Pierre Laclède and Auguste Chouteau, and named after Louis IX of France, St. Louis has always maintained close ties to France.


After the tragic fire at the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris on April 15, 2019, William "Pat" Partridge, Canon Precentor Organist and Choirmaster of Christ Church Cathedral in St. Louis had an idea for some sort of a musical fund raiser to help with the restoration of the historic organ. He contacted AGO chapter Dean Burnell Hackman who was enthusiastic and with the help of Alliance Française de St. Louis, Bastille Day 2019, July 14, was chosen for a French Music Marathon at Christ Church Cathedral.

A call was issued to members of the St. Louis Chapter of the AGO and the following stepped forward to play music by French composers: Dr. Steven Ball, Dr. Kathleen Bolduan, Nancy Barbee, Clark Davis, Roy Kroezen, Jennifer Spohr, Dr. William Sullivan (AAGO), Brent Johnson, Thomas Lee, Kevin Uppercue, Jae Park, Randy Zerkel, David Sindén, Gaye Anderson, Dr. Andrzej Zahorski, Timothy Jansen, Dr. Stephen Mager (AAGO, ChM), Earl Naylor and William Partridge.

What resulted was a four-hour concert of French Organ Music. During the marathon, over 400 people attended the event with many staying for the entire four hours.

Music Critic of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, Sarah Bryan Miller provided excellent pre-concert coverage with a half page article, the local classical music station conducted a live interview with Mr. Partridge and our chapter's local radio program "The King of Instruments" (KOI) provided additional publicity.

Over \$5,000 was collected! Thank You St. Louis. Mr. Partridge was so inspired by the tremendous day, he is looking forward to a similar event in the future!

AVIS BLEWETT AWARD 2019

CONGRATULATIONS!

At the Chapter's Annual Meeting in May, the Avis Blewett Award was presented to two outstanding St. Louisans. The Avis Blewett Award was established in celebration of the 75th anniversary of the American Guild of Organists in Missouri. The award is present by the St. Louis Chapter AGO to those who have made a significant contribution to the musical life in the St. Louis area. The chapter was pleased to present this award to the following: Sarah Bryan Miller and Dr. Joseph Beck.

Sarah Bryan Miller has been the classical music critic of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch since September 1, 1998. Miller has been consistently supportive of and an advocate for organ and choral music in the St. Louis area. She is a former Chicago-based professional mezzo-soprano who was a member of the Lyric Opera of Chicago Chorus; a soloist with Chicago Opera Theatre, Grant Park Concerts, the Lyric Opera Center for American artists and other organizations; and a freelance writer who was a frequent contributor to publications including The New York Times and the Wall Street Journal. She joined the Girls' Choir at St. Michael & All Angels Episcopal Church in Mission, Kansas, at the age of eight. While living in Chicago, she sang at the Cathedral of St. James, and with Richard Proulx at Holy Name Cathedral. Miller is a member of the choir at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Ladue.

Dr. Joseph Beck is author of the recent book about Dr. John Finley Williamson, founder of Westminster Choir College. Dr. Beck is a Benefactor of Westminster and is the Historian for the tradition there. He has also been involved with saving Westminster Choir College from a takeover. Dr. Beck is retired, and he and his wife, Sally, live in Webster Groves. He has directed Choral Activities at Webster University and St. Louis University, and is still highly regarded as a voice teacher.




