Executive Committee Meeting Summary March 16, 2009

The Executive Committee of the Saint Louis Chapter of the American Guild of Organists met at Trinity Presbyterian Church on March 16, 2009.

• In response to an inquiry about the availability of scholarship funds for participants in the upcoming Kansas City Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) June 21-26, 2009, the executive committee discussed the importance of supporting organ students of Chapter instructors. The committee approved a process to receive a letter of application and request for scholarship assistance from the student and his/her teacher. After review of the applications and requests by the executive committee, if approved, the scholarship assistance will be forwarded to the Kansas City POE on the student's behalf.

• The Chapter office nomination procedure was included in the January *OPUS* issue. The Nominating Committee has selected candidates for the three 2012 members at large positions. Their biographical sketches and the official ballot are included in this *OPUS* issue.

• The executive committee received a nomination for the Avis Blewitt Award to be presented at the May annual meeting. The format of the May meeting, to be held at Centenary United Methodist Church, was discussed.

• The Program Committee is well underway in its planning of an exciting and engaging program for the 2009-2010 program year. The St. Louis Chapter will also be hosting a POE in 2010. We are still in need of someone willing to chair the 2010 POE effort. 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
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Biographical Sketches of Nominees for the Executive Committee

Robert Chamberlin

Robert Chamberlin is director of music theory and musicianship and teaches music theory and composition at Webster University. He holds degrees in music theory and composition from St. Olaf College and Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. He did additional graduate work in composition at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and spent a month in Haarlem, The Netherlands, learning how to play the 31-tone-peroctave pipe organ at the Tyler's Museum.

Bob has composed for a variety of ensembles and media and his music has been performed throughout the U.S., Canada, the Netherlands and Poland. He is the recipient of a Creative Artists Award from the Missouri Arts Council and has received a variety of commissions including those from the Webster Symphony Orchestra, the USAF Band of Mid-America, Metro Theatre Company and the Mid-America Dance Company.

Bob is currently the organist at Webster Groves Christian Church. Prior to that he was organist at Gethsemane Lutheran Church (ELCA).

David Erwin

David Erwin has been director of music ministry at Ladue Chapel Presbyterian Church and a member of the St. Louis AGO chapter since 2005, serving on the program committee for three years. He is a graduate of Westminster Choir College and has done extensive organ study in Paris with Marie-Louise Langlais. Prior to Ladue Chapel, he was director of music at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Alexandria, Va., and at First Presbyterian Church, Greenwich, Conn. He is a member of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians and was on the faculty for the 2008 Worship and Music Conference in Montreat, N.C. He serves on the Community Partnership Advisory Board of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, and is a member of the St. Wilfrid Club of New York City.
