Looking for Printed Music? Check Several Useful Sites on the Internet!

The advent of the Internet has given musicians a new resource for their continuing appetite for old and new compositions. Publishers have discovered that there is a definite market for their wares online, making ordering easy.

But don't overlook the many free sources of printed music on the Net. Perhaps some of you have already discovered these sites, but they may be new to others. Whether you are "in need" or just want to spend some time looking, check out these sites where are all types of free music are available for the printing.

The Werner Icking Music Archive (WIMA) (*icking-music-archive.org/index.php*) offers primarily classical scores for a variety of instruments and combinations. It can be searched by composer. A number of contemporary composers also post their music here. Both PDF and publishing files are included.

Free-Scores.com (*www.free-scores.com*/ *index_uk.php3*) includes more than 8,500 pieces and does include some new composers. The site is searchable by both instrument and composer. PDF files are provided

From the St. Louis Chapter Dean...

Will There Be Trombones?

n late February at dinner before the Langlais program, I was listening to Paul Vasile and Henry Evans discuss the difficulties of finding brass players for Easter Sunday services. That started me thinking about the use of brass instruments for Easter celebrations, and remembering the time I was privileged to attend Easter sunrise service at Central Moravian Church in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania.

Central Moravian was built around 1810, with a large sanctuary and a belfry atop the center of the roof. Before the service, the trombone choir was in the belfry, playing chorales over the city rooftops. The group of 15 musicians, playing trombones of various sizes, joined with the organist and choir to provide hymn accompaniments during the service. At the end, the trombones led the singing congregation outside to conclude the service at the God's Acre as the sun rose.

When Bethlehem was settled around 1742, it was a frontier colony. There is a story, perhaps apocryphal, of the settlers scaring off raiding Indians by playing their trombones from the roof of the Brethren's house. True or not, it is amazing to me that anyone making the trip from Europe to the American frontier would carry musical instruments as part of their scant baggage. Two hundred fifty-some years later, the tradition and heritage of Moravian music (and the trombone choir) is still strong.

Hope to see you all at Central Presbyterian Church on March 31 for the "Organ and Instruments" program – maybe Paul will find a piece for organ and trombone! — Martha Shaffer
