**Otto Maria Krämer** was born in 1964, made his debut as a church organist in 1974 following his first piano lessons and has served as organist for a number of churches since. He started studying Catholic church music in 1986, at the Folkwang-Hochschule in Essen, continuing at the Robert-Schumann-Hochschule in Düsseldorf,

studying organ under Prof. Paul Heuser, composition under Prof. Herbert Callhoff and liturgical organ and improvisation under Prof. Wolfgang Seifen. He completed his studies in 1994 and has participated in several master classes, with the emphasis on organ improvisation, including the Second International Organ Academy, Altenberg, with Daniel Roth (Paris), Peter Planyavsky (Vienna), Wolfgang Stockmeier (Cologne) and Wolfgang Seifen (Berlin). From 1991 to 1993 he was organist and choir-master in Mönchengladbach; since October 1993 he has been Cantor of the church of St. Peter and Paul in Straelen.

Mr. Krämer is also active as a composer. His works include "Fünf symphonische Momente" for organ, 1992; "Prélude et Fugue dansée sur le nom de GASTON" for organ 1995, "Messe brève" for four-part choir and organ, 1996, "Subvenite" for soprano, baritone, organ and orchestra, 1998 "Messe solennelle" from Louis Vierne arranged for orchestra and organ 1999; "Epitaph for jsb" for organ 2000; "Exsultate Deo" for four-part-choir and organ 2000.

Since 1997 he has also been musical director of the Chamber Choir cappella-cantica Nettetal. He gives regular organ concerts, with an emphasis on improvisation through the ages and styles. His speciality in im-



He played recitals in Switzerland, Poland, Sweden, Switzerland, Lithuania, Russia (St. Petersburg), Germany, USA (Chicago, Washington, Tuscon, etc.) and Canada. His current USA tour is scheduled for Sept. 2003 with recitals and masterclasses in New York, San Francisco, Berkeley, Chicago, Pasadena, Los Angeles, and St. Louis.

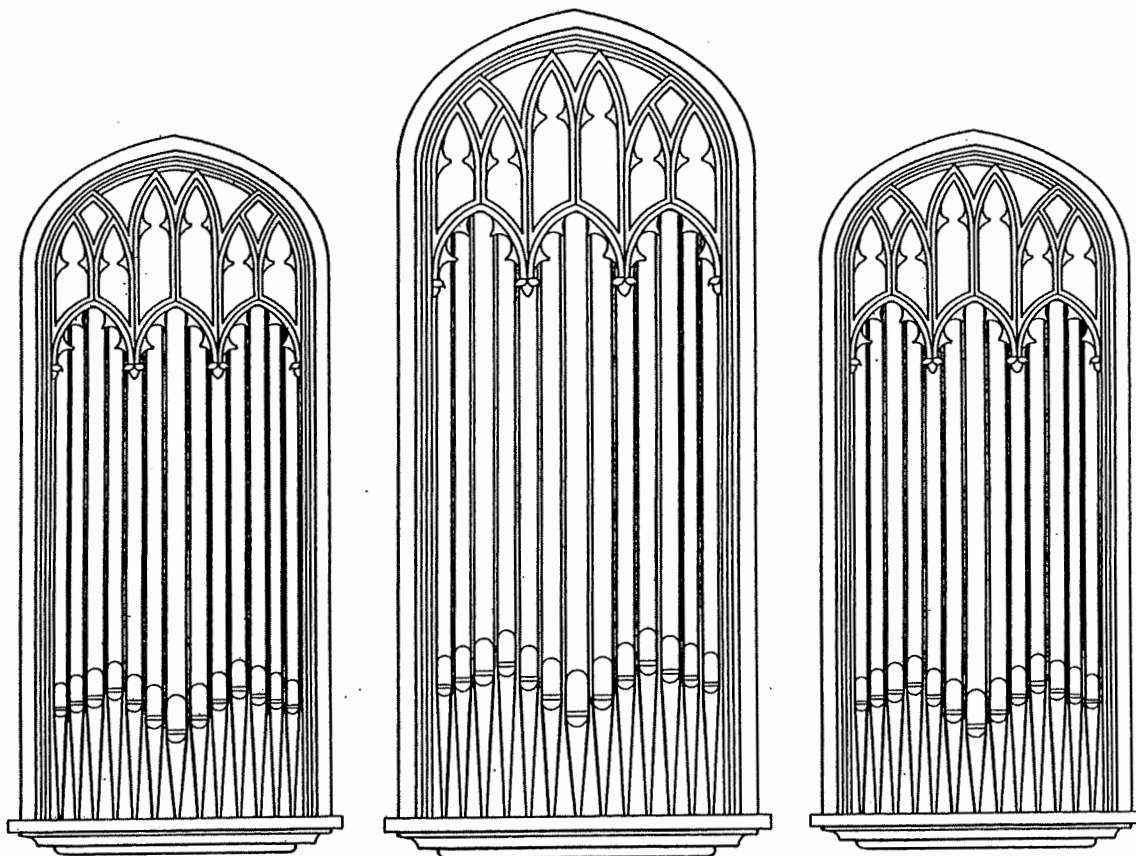

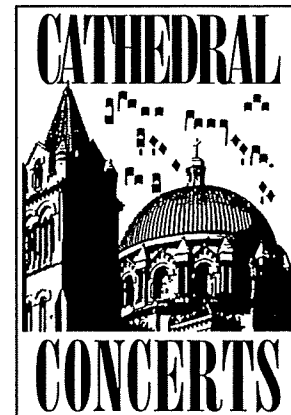
