Happy Autumn! May this greeting find you in good health and spirits.

What a treat we heard on Sunday, October 25th! Dr. Steven Ball played an excellent program celebrating Reformation Sunday, featuring compositions arranged or composed for the Carillon. In the first half, Dr. Ball explored a variety of arrangements of *Ein Feste Burg*, known to us as "A Mighty Fortress". We also heard music from the 16th-19th centuries, culminating in a premiere of Dr. Ball's arrangement of the *Andante* from Mendelssohn's Symphony in D, op. 107, "Reformation". The second half of the program consisted of music composed specifically for the Carillon.

On November 16th at 7:00 p.m., Mark Lawson will lead a *LIVE* virtual choral reading session focusing on accessible music that can be used during this time. There will be a talk-back session at the end to discuss the different kinds of literature that people feel they will be looking for in the months ahead.

Dear Colleagues:

Another Christian Church Year will soon be coming to a close and the season of Advent will quickly be upon us. A common theme of Advent is HOPE. Like me, I am sure most all of you are continually


looking for signs of hope.

Our days seem to be filled with chaos from the COVID-19 pandemic, social unrest and political mayhem, not to mention what each of us may be facing on a personal level at any given moment. Many of the Scripture readings from the common lectionary for the Advent

season speak of both lament and hope. Perhaps with the prophet Isaiah we, too, cry out: "Do not be exceedingly angry, O Lord, and do not remember iniquity forever. Now consider, we are all your people." (Isaiah 64:9) Yet we also cling to hope as we are told: "Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the Glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." (Isaiah 40: 4-5)

I have already been rehearsing with a soloist to prepare and record the aria "The People That Walked in Darkness" from the *Messiah* by G. F. Handel for one of our worship videos. Each time we have rehearsed, hearing those familiar words ("The people that walked in darkness have

seen a great light, and they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined") has filled me with hope. But I also have discovered the hymn text from 2008 by Mary Louise Bringle based on Isaiah 9:2-7. (The text appears as hymn #86 in the



How vast is our God's dominion! How far truth and mercy extend. The zeal of the Lord will accomplish its purpose: Justice shall reign without end.

May we all find hope to cling to during these challenging times. And may we, in turn, find ways to share that hope with others in our music making.

Since this issue of the *OPUS* covers both the months of November and December, let me say: Happy Thanksgiving; Merry Christmas; Happy Hanukkah; Joyous Kwanzaa!
