

# February Flourish 2023

#### A Trio of Happenings

February Flourish 2023 at Peace Lutheran Church in Saint Louis, Missouri was a valuable "Trio of Happenings." Sponsored by the Saint Louis Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, the support of the local chapter of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians and the Handbell Association of Greater Saint Louis added to the variety of offerings. The "Trio of Happenings" on February 10-12 included Friday Evening Prayer in the Style of Taizé, Saturday workshops, networking, and exhibits, and a Sunday recital by Dr. Steven Wente of Concordia University, Chicago.

Evening Prayer was led by members of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians who previously worked with Brothers from the Taizé community. On Saturday, close to 60 attendees shared in the conference, with topics ranging from "Being Yourself in Ministry" to "Celebrating César Franck" to "Ministry in Diverse Settings" to "Healthy Handbell Ringing." The weekend events were powerfully brought to a close with a Sunday organ recital, in which Dr. Wente included music from black, young, and women composers. The themes of peace, faith and hope gave shape and meaning to his wonderful performance.

Thanks go to Burnell Hackman and the congregation of Peace Lutheran Church for hosting us with such generosity and efficiency. The February Flourish Planning Team was essential to its success: Registrar Rick Burk, Treasurer Mike Kaberline, local arrangements Burnell Hackman, Publicity Suzanne Chisum and Brent Johnson, New Member Coordinator Nannette Tornblom, Chapter Registrar Regina Morris, Dean Jeff White and Sub-Dean Mary Beth Wittry. # **CLASS OF 2026**

Stephen studied music composition and theory with composer John Huggler at the University of Massachusetts Boston MA. After completing a BA in Theory and Composition and a BA in English Literature he went to graduate school in SUNY Fredonia New York. His primary composition teacher there was Donald Bohlen. He completed his Masters degree in Composition and Theory and earned his teaching certificate in Vocal music K-12. After twenty-five years teaching vocal music in the St. Louis Public Schools Stephen retired from teaching in June 2015. His career as a part-time church musician began when he started student teaching. He had been a choir director and an organist before moving to St. Louis. In St.

In St. Louis Stephen was the organist at St. Philips Lutheran for ten years and was the Minister of Music for ten years at Church of the Open Door UCC. 
