

This is a reminder that the St. Louis AGO Chapter will reimburse any members who successfully complete a certification exam of the exam expenses. If you're not certified, why not make it a goal

this year. If you're already playing regularly for church services, then the Service Playing Certificate is well within your grasp. This basic level of AGO Certification tells employers and other organists that you are very capable of fulfilling the musical needs of just about any denomination. Even if you don't complete the exam, the repertoire can serve as steps to improving your playing skills and your own service repertoire.



To begin the process, a candidate for the Service Playing exam must apply at <a href="www.agohq.org/certification">www.agohq.org/certification</a> anytime between September 1, 2023, and February 1, 2024. The exam must be complet-

ed by March 31, 2024. There is no written component to this exam, and the playing can be done on any organ you choose. Complete requirements for each certificate are available at www.agohq.org/ certification. If you have questions about the process, feel free to contact our chapter's Certification Coordinator Brent Johnson at brent@brentjohnson.net.

# CHAPTER ARCHIVES

At our Chapter program in September 2021, Chapter Historian, Randy Zerkel, shared some interesting tidbits of our Chapter's history with many items on display. Later, in October 2022, the Chapter Executive Committee approved a request from the State Historical Society of Missouri (SHSMO) to have our historical archives stored and catalogued at their Research Center here in St. Louis. Shortly after that October meeting, Randy presented the SHSMO St. Louis Research Center with six boxes of materials.

If you are curious as to what has been submitted, or if you are wanting to do any research on our Chapter's history, please visit <a href="https://collections.shsmo.org/manuscripts/saint-louis/s0363">https://collections.shsmo.org/manuscripts/saint-louis/s0363</a>. Once you reach the landing page, you will want to click on the "finding aid" link, which will bring up the preliminary inventory for the materials. If you identify anything you want to view, you may contact AJ Medlock, <a href="medlocka@shsmo.org">medlocka@shsmo.org</a>, and schedule an appointment to view the materials at the SHSMO St. Louis office located at 222 Thomas Jefferson Library, 1 University Blvd., St. Louis, MO 63121. The facility is open Tuesdays through Fridays, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. They are also happy to fulfill digitization requests if the request isn't too extensive (i.e., requesting an entire box be digitized).


