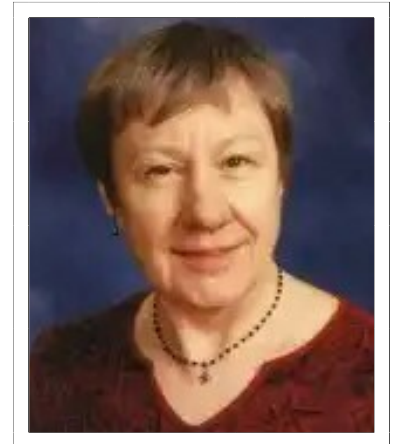

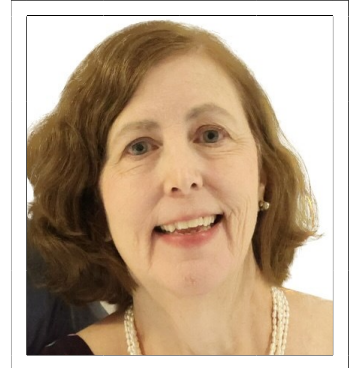

EARL NAYLOR

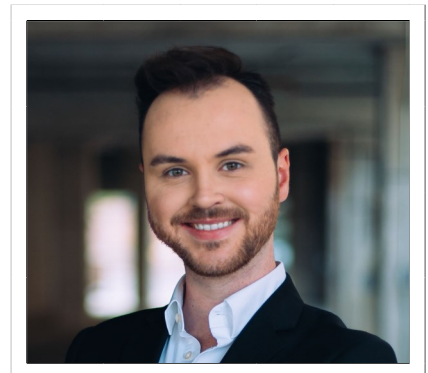

In addition to worship, he also directs the Coutts Music Series, which includes programs in various genres of music. Outside of his duties at Second Church, Spencer is also a tenor, pianist, and conductor. As a singer he is a full member of the St. Louis Chamber Chorus, and participates in projects with the South Dakota based choral ensemble Transept. As a collaborative pianist, Spencer has accompanied a variety of different ensembles including choirs, soloists, chamber music ensembles, and choral workshops throughout Eastern South Dakota and Northwestern Iowa at the high school and collegiate level. Smith is a member of area organizations including the American Guild of Organists. Spencer was previously the Director of Music & Arts Ministry at First Congregational Church in Sioux Falls, SD.

In May 2020, Spencer received a Master's Degree in Music with a specialization in Conducting, studying under Dr. David Holdhusen and Dr. Timothy Campbell at the University of South Dakota. Smith received a Bachelor's degree in Piano Performance from the University of South Dakota in the spring of 2017 where he studied piano with Dr. Susanne Skyrn and collaborative piano and chamber music with Dr. Susan Keith Gray. He studied organ under the direction of Dr. Larry Schou.

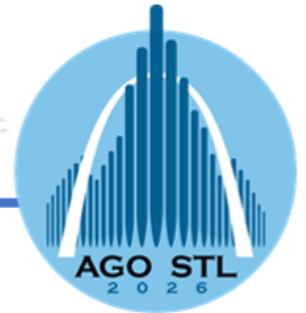

St. Louis 2026 AGO National Convention Update

The 2026 National AGO Convention in St. Louis is less than 840 days away. While that is still over two years in the future, much work has already been done and much more work will follow!

I am pleased to announce Conner Scott is joining the Steering Committee as Young Organist Committee Chair. Some of this committee's duties include: Creating opportunities and activities to engage Young Organists; sponsoring a bench day for Young Organists and planning social events for Young Organists during the Convention. There are several Young Organist Scholarships offered to the Convention and this committee will be responsible for administering these scholarships.

Conner is the new Music Director at Christ Church Cathedral. Before attending graduate school in California Conner was organist at Holy Communion Episcopal Church and Webster United Methodist Church. We welcome Conner back to St. Louis and to the Steering Committee.

Also joining the Steering Committee is Heather Martin-Cooper. Heather, along with her committee, will be the Liaison for the Rising Stars. This will include all aspects regarding the Rising Stars program including arranging transportation, rehearsal times, and social activities.

Heather is a free-lance musician in St. Louis having served for many years at St. Monica's Parish. She is a longtime member of the St. Louis Chapter and recently served as Sub-Dean.

We welcome these two additions to the Steering Committee.

Later in April I will attend the AGO National Council's Meeting in Atlanta, Georgia. At this meeting I will present our proposed program and budget. We have it on good authority that Avis Blewitt will be attending the San Francisco Convention to encourage people to come to St. Louis in 2026!

The Facebook Page is focused on posting all Chapter activities and events. It also shares organ events of the Guild’s Chapter members. Other organ events in the community are also highlighted here.

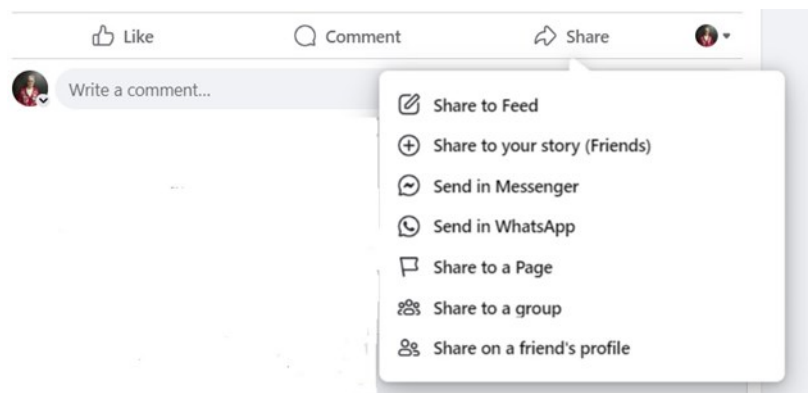

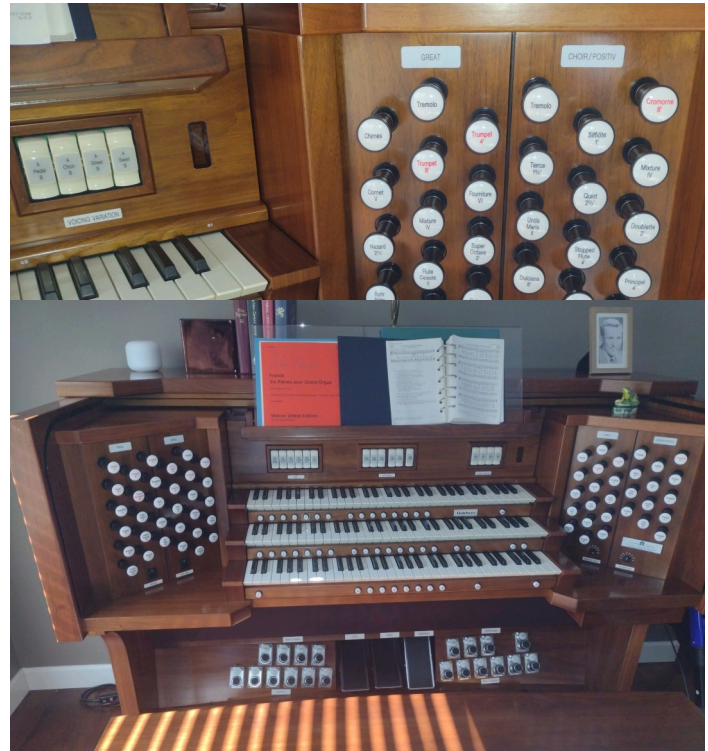
