In Memoriam

Sadly we share with you the following recent obituaries.

Patricia Pruden Partridge, 86, of Webster Groves, Missouri, passed away in the early hours of Saturday, November 16, 2024. Trish was born in Washington, D.C. on July 7, 1938. A graduate of Woodrow Wilson High School, Trish went on to attend the University of Richmond, followed by Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music. As a skilled pianist, Trish was certified in the Suzuki method of piano teaching and taught for many years, first at the Preparatory School of Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore, and privately for more than forty years. Many of her students both in Baltimore and St. Louis, would remember Trish's distinctive approach to shaping young musicians. In addition to teaching piano, Trish was a Coordinator of Volunteers for Bethesda Dilworth and then served as Office Administrator at Stages St. Louis. Trish is survived by her husband of 63 years, William "Pat" Partridge; and three children, Philip Partridge (Steven), Christopher Partridge (Susan), and Elizabeth Perkins. Trish was a most beloved grandmother to Will Partridge-Walsh, Stefaun Partridge-Walsh (Grace), Avery Partridge, Lily Partridge, Elena Perkins, and Andrew Perkins. In addition, she was a great-grandmother to Andre Partridge-Walsh. Trish leaves behind a brother, Edward Hughes Pruden Jr. (Peggy) of Richmond, Virginia; two nieces, a nephew, and many beloved cousins. A celebration of life will be held for Trish at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, January 19, 2025, at The Piper Palm House located in Tower Grove Park, with a reception immediately following.

Long time former member of our Chapter, **Ric Jaeggi**, died after a long bout with cancer. He was the Director of Music/Organist of Peace Lutheran Church, Fort Myers, FL. Ric studied with William Memmott at Memorial Presbyterian Church. He also studied at Cincinnati Conservatory of Music.

It is with the greatest sadness that we announce the passing of our dear friend **Al Haker**. Al was a member of the St. Louis Theater Organ Society because of his interest in pipe organs and not specifically because of theatre organs. He retired from the Postal Service giving him free time to volunteer and work on the Fox Theater lobby organ with Joe Barnes. Al was selected by Stan Kann to take care of the "Big Organ" and he did so, lovingly for over 25 years. It was his baby. Al was conscripted into service by Steve Crowe to put together an organ for the City Museum. Little did he know that the City Museum would become his second home and workshop, fostering unexpected friendships and recognition not only in the organ world but also by many people working at and visiting the museum. The museum organ has exposed hundreds of thousands of people to the theatre organ and much of that thanks is due to Al. Unable to let an important organ die, he took on creating a group of friends to rebuild the Scottish Rite Organ. He was so proud of its 100th anniversary celebration this past month.
