While practice is necessary, we also need to take time to walk away from the bench. That's right - back away from that keyboard! As with our electronic devices, spending long periods of time leaning into the console is strenuous on our bodies and minds as well. We need to get up occasionally and hit the "Reset" button.

At our September meeting, Katelyn Emerson emphasized the importance of body positioning and posture to help us play with greater comfort and less effort. She noted that we need those occasional breaks, both mentally and physically. I use YogAlign, a method of breathing and muscle engagement to reset good posture during practice. Many performance artists employ the Alexander Technique to the same purpose. Whatever your preference, it's a good idea to occasionally break away from the keyboard - or your cellular devices - or the TV - to stretch, align, and relieve tension. It just may give you that little bit of refreshment needed to keep going.



Our belated condolences to the family of William F. Bust

William Bust, age 86 of Highland, IL, died Saturday, March 15, 2025, at his residence in Highland, IL. He was born on Monday, November 21, 1938, in Potosi, MO, the son of Robert and Barbara (nee Mayer) Bust.

He was a member of St. Paul Catholic Church. He was also a member of Lee Iten Post #439, American Legion, V.F.W. Post #5694, Highland National Association of Pastoral Musicians, National Association of Railroad Passengers, National Railroad Historical Association, Co-founder and member of the Gateway East Chapter of The American Guild of Organists.

From September 5, 1961 to December 1, 1964 he served on active duty with the U.S. Army as Post Chaplain's Assistant at Fort Benjamin Harrison in Indianapolis, Indiana. Upon completion of military service, he moved to Highland, IL, to work at the Wicks Organ Company, retiring as service manager after 53 years. In addition to his position at Wicks, he served St. Paul Parish in Highland as the past Minister of Music and organist for the St. Paul Mixed Choir. He served St. Paul parish as an organist for 50 years.

A funeral Mass was held on Saturday, March 29, 2025, at St. Paul Catholic Church in Highland, IL.


As we get closer to the actual Convention, please be ready to say "YES" if you are contacted to serve in one capacity or another. There will be many, many opportunities.

The original stenciled design of this Jackson tracker organ was hidden under a layer of flaking, yellow varnish.

The pipes were stripped to bare metal, repainted and hand stenciled using copies of the original decorative patterns.




Repairs were made to all of the pipes, and new tuning slides were fabricated.



The organ was pitched to A=440, and given a thorough revoicing to achieve a more cohesive sound.
