Letter to the Editor:

The Beauty of Connection through AGO

It's hard to imagine becoming a "new" organist at the age of 60—but that's my story! I have only been a paid church organist for the past three years, and I owe my connection to the St. Louis Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) to the encouragement of my organ teacher, Regina Morris.

Since beginning organ lessons, I've had the privilege of serving as an organist for many different faith traditions—Roman Catholic, Christian Scientist, and Episcopal—and in a variety of languages: Latin, Croatian, Czech, and of course, English. This week alone, I'm preparing for a Croatian Catholic Mass on Friday, an English Catholic Mass on Saturday, and a bilingual Czech/English Mass on Sunday. My organ bench and office are piled high with music for each service. It keeps me busy!

One of the most remarkable things about being a member of AGO is the spirit of cooperation and generosity among its members—a willingness to help one another that I've rarely experienced in other professions.

A few weeks ago, the priest from the Croatian church where I had once been a long-term substitute organist reached out. Their organist was in the hospital, and he asked if I could play for Sunday's Croatian Mass. The problem? I was already committed to playing at St. John Nepomuk Chapel for an English Mass with some Czech hymns and a Czech choir.

At first, I thought I'd have to say no. But I reached out to fellow AGO members, and suggestions began to flow. That's how I connected with Heather Martin Cooper—someone I met through AGO four years ago—who happened to be available. Heather was more comfortable with the English Mass that included Czech hymns, so I checked with the parish administrator, who gladly approved. This allowed me to step in for the Croatian Mass.

Meanwhile, I posted on Facebook to see if anyone could cover the Croatian Church long-term. To my amazement, I heard from a young man who plays for the Vietnamese Mass at Resurrection Parish—he was willing to help!

In the end, both churches were covered, the needs were met, and two communities continued their worship without disruption. Moments like this remind me why I'm so grateful to be part of AGO. It's more than an organization—it's a network of generosity, friendship, and shared purpose.



Friday, October 24, 2025 Convention Fund Raising Gala


