News from the 2026 AGO National Convention Registrar

The biggest Convention Registration news for St. Louis AGO Chapter members this month is that the **Super Saver Rates end January 31, 2026**.

We encourage all Chapter members to register for the Convention this month, before that January 31, 2026, date catches you by surprise!.

There is an option to print an invoice and pay with a check. If you give our treasurer, Mike Kaberline, a check, rather than paying online, it saves us the credit card fee. You (or your employer) can also mail a check to the Convention post office box listed on the invoice.

You should have received an email back in November, with a direct link to the Registration site. I will be sending out a reminder email on January 15, 2026.






